




# HISTORICAL ADVENTURE LAND

## Fukui is filled with rich history, natural beauty, and unique cultural experiences that can only be found there. Plan your trip and rediscover yourself in Fukui.

Fukui Prefecture, known for its rich history and beautiful landscapes, is divided into two main areas: Reihoku in the north and Reinan in the south.

In the north, you'll find the famous Eiheiji Temple, one of the two head temples of the Soto Zen. Fukui is also home to the Prefectural **Dinosaur Museum**, one of the world's top three dinosaur museums, featuring fossils and life-sized replicas.

Nature lovers will enjoy Tojinbo, known for its dramatic cliffs overlooking the sea. Sabae, another city in the north, is famous for its eyeglass production, producing over 90% of Japan's eyeglass frames, making it a global leader in the eyewear industry.

In the south of Fukui, which borders Kyoto, tourist spots such as Kehi Jingu Shrine, the guardian shrine of the Hokuriku region is located.

Nearby, the Five Lakes of Mikata offer breathtaking views and opportunities for outdoor activities such as hiking and boating. Kumagawa-juku, a post town along the historic Saba Kaido (Mackerel Road), is rich in history and was an important trade route connecting Kyoto to Wakasa Province.
